0. Starter	The verb "To be"; subject / object personal pronouns – possessive adjectives – possessive pronouns; the verb "to have got"; there is / there are; possessive (s); family members; parts of the body; clothes; greetings & introductions; asking for / giving personal information
1. At work, at play	Present simple; prepositions of time; adverbs of frequency; question words (who, what, where, how old, when); time; daily routines; free-time activities; days of the week; weekend activities; school subjects; countries & nationalities; talking about likes and dislikes; talking about your school; answering questions about yourself; talking about free-time activities; pronunciation /ei/
2. Places around us	Prepositions of place; countable / uncountable nouns; quantifiers; some / any & their compounds; partitives; present continuous; prepositions of movement; places in a city; months and seasons; shops & products; plurals; houses; talking about your house and your neighbourhood; asking for / giving directions; word stress (three-syllable words)
3. Sports & Chores	Must / mustn't; can / may / would; order of adjectives; connection; imperative / let's; relative pronouns; household chores; sports; making invitations – accepting / refusing; talking about prohibitions; describing objects; talking about what to do / not to do in classroom; asking about information; pronunciation (linking sounds)
4. Legends	Was / were; there was / there were; could; past simple – regular verbs (affirmative); famous people; mythical creatures; appearance & character; noun formation (suffixes); pronunciation (strong and weak form); talking about past abilities; describing a film
5. Let's have fun!	Past simple – irregular verbs (affirmative); past simple – regular / irregular verbs (negative); past simple – regular / irregular verbs (interrogative); festivals / celebrations; party time; talking about a thing you had / did at your last birthday party; giving a summary of a story; talking about what you did / didn't do yesterday afternoon; narrating past events; intonation (high rising tone to express disbelief & great surprise)
6. Out and about	Going to (future plans & intentions); going to (predictions); indefinite / definite articles – a / an – the; question tags; -ing form & the infinitive; types of holidays & holidays activities; tourist attractions; discussing holiday plans; intonation in questions; talking about future plans & intentions; a dialogue about your holiday plans; making suggestions
7. Our wonderful world	Adverbs of manner; comparatives; too, very, really, quite; superlatives; Geographical features; means of transport; adjective formation (prefixes / suffixes); adverb formation (-ly); talking about the way you like to travel; talking about two places in your country; buying a ticket; acting out a dialogue; acting out telephone conversation; pronunciation (silent letters)
